Dear Mountain Meadows Descendants Member,

We wanted to let you know of some upcoming activities that you are cordially invited to attend.

June 14th and 15th some of us are traveling to St. George, Utah. On Friday the 15th, we will travel to Mountain Meadows to view the five (5) monuments, the beautiful signs that now reflect the historically accurate story of what happened to our kin, AND view the beautiful personal memorial markers that have been placed all around the main monument. We've placed individual markers for each person we have names for! A dream-come-true.

We need to know asap if you plan to attend, as we have rooms reserved at the Clarion Inn, 1239 S. Main St., in St. George. If you call them, (844-703-4215) ask for Diana Hawks and tell her you're with Mountain Meadows Massacre Descendants for MMMD rate.

On Friday night, the 15th, we are (tentatively) planning on partnering with the Washington County Historical Society in St. George to hold a "town meeting." We will have a PowerPoint presentation of the signs and the new memorial markers, and share information about the massacre/burial valley. We'll also learn about a "Juanita Brooks Project." Ms. Brooks wrote the first "*Mountain Meadows Massacre*" book.

Retired Judge Roger V. Logan, Jr., will be in attendance and we're attempting to plan a tour of some sites in the local area relating to the massacre. We did this a couple of years ago and it was fantastic. So much history involving this painful story!

Also, (again tentatively) we are planning to donate Mountain Meadows exhibits to the Carroll County Historical Society in Berryville, Arkansas; and the Boone County Historical Society in Harrison, Arkansas, the weekend of September 8th. We have pictures, plaques, the handmade 1857 flag that was placed on the child's burial box, and exact replicas of the two handmade burial wraps that the little child's remains were wrapped and buried in. These plans are all still "in the works" so watch the website for updates.

Please keep watching our website mmmd1857.org for more information, as it becomes available. We have a live web cam pointing at the main monument. Go onto our website and see! Beautiful!!
